An additional US\$50/month/child will assist in supporting the Centre's operational expenditure, including electricity, staff and transport costs.

PROJECTS NEWS

We are glad to report some of the achievements especially from the dairy, poultry and horticultural projects. Also with the huge assistance from various donors to support the capital projects, we are happy to report that the Maize Milling and the Sunflower Extracting Oil project are now complete and operational since May 2015. So many donors joined in to assist in this project and we have already acknowledged most of them in person.

The Maktau Mountain View Lodge

The Maktau Mountain View Lodge is now three quarters of the way to its completion but for it to start operating, more funds are needed. What remains is the fitting out and commissioning of these buildings for guests so that profitable income can begin to be generated.

The Board of Trustees estimates that an additional Tsh250m is required for commissioning. We are now looking for individual and corporate donors of Tsh10m or more so that this project with great social benefit to orphaned children can go ahead.
